

## **SOCIAL PROGRAM**

The participants will be invited to the Welcome Reception on October 22. The Banquet will be held on October 24.

## Excursions to the State Hermitage and St. Isaac's Cathedral will be organized for the participants.

The Hermitage Museum is the largest art gallery in Russia and is among the largest and most respected art museums in the world. During 240 years of its existence the museum accumulated a collection of almost three million exhibits, including significant art collections of Ancient East, Ancient Greece and Rome, Islamic arts, Italian Renaissance, XIX—XX centuries paintings, etc.

St. Isaac's Cathedral is the forth largest domed cathedral in the world, after the Cathedral of St. Peter in Rome, the Cathedral of St. Paul in London and the Cathedral of St. Maria in Florence. More that 150 paintings, mosaic works and 300 sculptures made by well-known Russian painters and sculptors decorate the interior of the Cathedral.

The participants and guests will also be offered some optional excursions.

1 day post-tour-I "Peterhof-Oranienbaum" Peterhof is a jewel of the Russian art, a town of parks, palaces and fountains. In the past it used to be an exquisite summer residence of the Russian tsars. The Upper and the Lower Parks are the masterpieces of art of gardening numbering over 170 fountains, 5 monumental cascades. In August 2000, after a 60-years break the second largest cascade Lviny was opened. On the territory of the reserve there are 9 working museums: the Grand Peterhof Palace, Monplaisir, Catherine's Block, Marli, Hermitage, Saint-Alexander Nevsky Church, the Benois family museum, Cottage and the Bath block with newly restored rooms and kitchen. Excursion to Peterson is often enlarged with the excursion to Oranienbaum, which is 15 minutes by car from Peterhof.

The architectural and landscape complex of Oranienbaum is a unique palace and park ensemble of the 18th – early 20th century, which survived World War II in its historic condition. The palaces-museums of Oranienbaum are located in the territory of the Upper Landscape Park and the Lower Regular Garden with the total area of 162 hectares. Its structure includes three architectural ensembles, reflecting the history of this estate throughout the 18th century.

1 day post-tour-II "Great Novgorod" The Old Russian town Veliky Novgorod (Great Novgorod) is situated close to St. Petersburg, just about 180 km (112 miles) from it. And simultaneously you'll travel in time. Great Novgorod is known as the most ancient town in Russia, since its history has begun about 12 centuries ago and the whole novgorodian land is the oldest part of Russia. Novgorod Kremlin (fortress), various temples and uncountable monasteries, everything breathes here with mysterious and beautiful history of Russia, from its earliest age.

You will be informed of the details of the sightseeing tour programs and their costs in the Second Circular.
